Alternatives Incorporated of Madison County	Mobile App for Domestic Violence Survivors	Funding will be used to implement a mobile app with our nonresidential services for survivors. The app allows for communication through a traceless messaging channel. It comes with a “wrapper” that makes it appear as a coloring page, game, or other non-communication based app when viewed on the survivor’s phone. Any alerts or notifications appear as a reminder to “play today”, masking it from the abuser so they remain unaware the survivor is seeking help.	\$2,972.00
American Red Cross	Home Fire Relief in Madison County	The Home Fire Relief program is an ongoing, year-round program through which the Red Cross delivers help, hope and healing to hundreds of Madison County residents affected by home fires each year. Upon notification of a home fire, the Red Cross dispatches trained volunteers to address a family’s immediate needs and to offer ongoing recovery casework and assistance. These services—provided at no cost to clients—bridge the gap between their current resources and those required for full recovery.	\$5,000.00
Anderson First Church of the Nazarene	Youth Programming for Community Center at AFC	With this grant request, we will utilize any funds given to create and enhance after-school programming for youth in our community. We already have a dedicated community room for students but would like to invest in more programming and with that, programming supplies, to better equip who we can. Programs investments are to include: after-school tutoring, academic coaching, esports, life skill development (financial planning/ budgeting, nutrition, etc.)	\$5,000.00
Anderson Impact Center	The Senior Adult Meal Program	The Senior Adult Meal Program reduces the threat of hunger and food insecurity among senior citizens (55+). The program provides free nutritious meals to neighborhood seniors, that are prepared with the most recent dietary guidelines for Americans. Meals are provided in a congregate setting that affords many opportunities for education, recreation, socializing, health screenings, and more. Cancer Support Community Indiana	Patient Assistance Fund	Cancer Support Community is respectfully requesting funding to help provide critical basic needs support to underserved patients in Madison County community facing a cancer diagnosis. The Patient Assistance Fund was created to provide CSC’s lowest-income participants with financial aid for groceries (\$100 Kroger card) and transportation (\$50 Speedway card), alleviating an undue stress on those facing a cancer diagnosis in our community.	\$2,500.00

Catalyst Youth Center	Snack Attack Clubs	<p>Our after school programming is called Snack Attack. It offers a safe place for students to come and hang out as well as be fed a meal. During this time, we offer different activities for the students to participate in if they choose. We would like to expand this program to offer different clubs that they are able to participate in. After connecting with the public library, the Purdue extension, and teachers from the school, we have found sponsors for these different clubs. The clubs we are looking at starting are Chess Club, Cooking Club, Art Club, Crocheting Club, STEM club, Robotics Club, Plant Club, and more. This will not only provide positive things for these students to do, but it will teach them life skills and allow them to discover career paths. Our organization also loves placing positive adult role models in the students lives.</p>	\$5,000.00
College Mentors for Kids	College Mentors for Kids mentor program at Anderson University	<p>College mentors and elementary school "little buddies" meet weekly, afterschool, for two-hour long activities during the academic year. On-campus activities focus on three activity topics: higher education &amp; career, community service, and culture &amp; diversity. Kids are bussed to campus for activities and have 16-18 sessions during the school year. Activities follow a structure that includes a snack, skill-building component, guest speaker, hands-on educational activity, and a reflection time.</p>	\$5,000.00
Firefly Children & Family Alliance	Expanded Safe Sleep Education	<p>Through Firefly's prevention program, Community Partners for Child Safety, highly trained Community Liaisons provide in-home assessment and case management to help families achieve their goals and self-sufficiency. One of the key components of case management for many families with young children is safe sleep education. Grant funds will support this effort through the provision of one-on-one education, group classes, and a community baby shower.</p> <p>Safe Sleep is an evidence-based program designed by the Indiana State Department of Health in collaboration with the Department of Child Services. Participants receive an Infant Survival Kit which includes one pack-n-play, a wearable blanket, a pacifier and take-home recommendations. We provide monthly classes serving 5 to 8 families and one-on-one education. The community baby shower offers a low-barrier, low-stigma opportunity for families to receive educational materials and obtain much needed safe sleep and infant safety supplies.</p>	\$5,000.00

Indiana Women In Need Foundation (IWIN Foundation)	Madison County Survivor Support Program	Although IWIN serves patients statewide, the purpose of this grant proposal is to provide support services for underserved Madison County residents who are experiencing emotional, financial or physical burdens during breast cancer treatment. By providing non-medical support services to patients facing obstacles to treatment, IWIN increases equal access to healthcare, impacts the ability to stay engaged in treatment and improves quality of life. IWIN requests a \$3,200 grant for its Madison County Survivor Support Program, which facilitates professional support services valued at \$400 per recipient to meet the non-medical needs of individuals undergoing breast cancer treatment living at an annual household income of 300% of Federal Poverty Level or less and residing in Madison County. Support from the MCCF will directly serve eight (8) individuals struggling with breast cancer care. Overall, IWIN's Madison County Survivor Support Program will serve 25 patients over the coming year.	\$3,200.00
Anderson Area Children's Choir	Anderson Area Children's Choir Artistic and Music Education Programs	The AACC provides music education programs for young people from preschool through high school in Anderson and Madison County, including three choirs based on age and ability. These choirs rehearse and learn music weekly throughout the school year, perform in concerts, sing at civic events, and collaborate with arts organizations and community agencies. We also provide a Summer Music Camp that in 2022 engaged 25 participants in Madison County. In 2023-2024 we also plan to add our Music At Play (MAP) program for preschool children. Funding will enable us to sustain these programs, increase enrollment in our choirs, and strengthen our community presence and public awareness throughout Madison County.	\$5,000.00
Minority Health Coalition of Madison County, Inc	PACEs (Positive Anderson Childhood Experiences)	<p>PACEs will offer the youth in Anderson an opportunity to interact with loving and energetic adults during enrichment activities where they can learn and have fun. The MHCMC will have an after-school sports program. The sport programs will be offered in 8-week sessions. Below are some of the benefits of youth participating in sports:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Increased Physical Activity and Health.</li> <li>2. Provides an opportunity for you to form social and community bonds.</li> <li>3. Families are able to shop with and for their children and pick out up to one weeks worth of clothing & 5 new pairs of underwear & 5 new pairs of socks as well as receive a \$25 shoe voucher for a new pair of sneakers. These funds would support the purchase of new socks, underwear and the shoe vouchers.	\$5,000.00

Society of St Vincent	Providing Basic Living Supplies to Our Clients	This grant will provide funds for needed non-food items to our clients, which are not covered by food stamps. When clients visit our warehouse, whether to obtain financial assistance or to pick up household furniture, they are provided non-food item kits to take home with them. These kits consist of basic household items such as laundry detergent, dish soap, toilet paper, paper towels, and bar soap. Upon request personal hygiene kits are also given- consisting of shampoo, deodorant, cleaning supplies, and toothbrushes. Home visitors offer similar kits to clients. In addition, dish packs can be obtained by our clients in which hand held can openers are provided along with donated dishes and silverware.	\$2,500.00
South Meridian Church of God	Neighborhood Connections	Part 1: Cooperative Cooking - food access is a concern for many, and we are working to create a relational and sustainable way of supporting these neighbors. This part of the project would allow us to host a group cooking time in the kitchen at South Meridian on a regular basis. We would work on recipe planning with neighbors who sign up to be involved, and each participant would contribute something to the recipe/process.
